

Delegate Report from the 2005 Annual ASRT meeting.

Proceedings over the four-day event went smoothly with initial legislative session held on Sunday, June 5 with opening ceremonies. 192 Delegates were initially seated in the House with 93 Affiliate delegates and 99 chapter delegates in attendance. Adoption of conference standing rules as amended was accepted.

The conference program was changed and adopted. Results of national elections were shared. A memorial resolution was introduced recognizing ASRT members who have passed away this past year. The ASRT annual report was presented as was the report on the ASRT Education and Research Foundation.

Initial nominations were introduced for Vice Speaker of the House. Linda Holden, the present speaker of the House, was nominated for a second term as speaker. Two late resolutions were introduced. Both failed to gain two-thirds support to be considered at this conference.

On Tuesday, June 7 the House of Delegates met to complete the work and charges before the House. 189 initial delegates were seated. This number fluctuated throughout the day as some delegates were added and some left.

The Committee on Bylaws introduced several changes to the newly adopted bylaws that will take effect at the end of the 2006 meeting. A review of each of these can be found at the ASRT website; [www.asrt.org](http://www.asrt.org) Four provisos were also introduced and accepted for the sake of smooth transitioning from the current house of delegates to the evolving configuration that will be in place in 2008.

Reference committee reports were introduced on Administration, Education, and Professional Practice. These include the resolutions that were brought before the house this year. Twenty-three (23) resolutions were dealt with by the House. Resolutions 05-1.03 A, B; 05-3.03 A, B; and 05-3.14 were referred to committee. Resolution 05-3.06 was withdrawn. Resolution 05-3.17 was not accepted. All other resolutions were acted on with all being accepted with no change, minor changes, or major amendments. A late resolution 05-1.04 was accepted. All resolution results can be found on the ASRT website.

This year is the beginning of the implementation of the new bylaws transition plan. Over the next two years several changes will be required by our society. These include establishing incorporation of our society, aligning our bylaws so that they are in agreement with the ASRT, renewal of our charter with the ASRT which will be reviewed and possibly re-established, and developing and strengthening our affiliate relationship with the national organization.
